# 3. Master Plan & Presidents Report

- Brett, Tim D, CHS & DoE to meet in early June to recommence talks about the school.
- 688-692 Pacific Hway rumoured to be sold for \$18m.
  - i. The Uniform Shop will need to vacate by end of Term 3.
  - ii. Rent to be paid \$100/wk that will be donated back to the school.
  - iii. Plans for interim Uniform Shop will begin.
- 9 Centennial Ave, it appears opportunity may have slipped as the owners have had no luck in contacting DoE about them purchasing it.
- Capacity Campaign has had more than 591 letters sent to DoE and there has been good Media coverage.

# 4. Confirmation of previous minutes

# 5. Correspondence

# 6. Principal's report

- <u>NAPLAN</u> completed for the year, all seemed to go well.
- <u>360 Survey</u> The Front office is trying to do a survey on their effectiveness, Tim asked for people to sign up to complete this. A sheet was handed around.
- New AP position Instructional Leadership
  - i. To assist in Literacy Pedagogy
  - ii. To help teachers learn
- Mark Scott visiting the school on 25<sup>th</sup> May to see our Bilingual, STEM & Asian programmes
- Enrolment numbers at 1235, expected to increase at start of Term 3
- Oval current completion date is end of July
  - i. Terry McK has negotiated use of part of the oval.
  - ii. Tim D gets regular updates from Council about progress.

# • Bush Campus

- i. Deck to be painted during July holidays.
- **ii.** There will be remedial work to grassed area within campus, this will then become a quiet play area.
- **iii.** The Meadow use will be limited except for Environmental Ed and the style and intensity of use will reassessed.
- Main Campus Play Equipment & Sponge Area were repaired during the holidays.

### Chatswood Public School P&C

- Heritage remediation work on Main Building is nearing completing at a cost of \$500k.
- <u>Coonamble trip</u> will go ahead in October working on a different itinerary as suggested by Coonamble. Up to 30 Year 4-6 will go in a dedicated bus.
  - i. Two teachers have recently done a stint as casual teachers.
  - ii. Coonamble is 90% indigenous, and 90% unemployment.
- Music Program is going well under new system.
  - i. Some tutors have left as they could not work afternoons.
  - ii. Many instruments are now outsourced.
  - iii. Directors have rooms around the school for daytime lessons also.
- Fencing the P&C organised some additional fencing on the Main Campus to protect plants.
- Student & Community Wellbeing
  - i. The P&C ran an evening Parent & Child Interrelate course because they felt there was a gap in the school program where Sex Education was only been taught to Year 6 in class.
  - **ii.** Going forward the School will provide Sex Education in class for Year 5 & 6 and in conjunction with the P&C offer an evening program for Families for Years 3-6.
  - iii. On top of Standard Curriculum subjects the school offers for:
    - Stage 1 Healthy Harold as a playful approach to empower our children to make safer and healthier choices
    - Stage 2 Healthy Skills for Life. Touching on bullying, resilience, mindfulness, thinking in the present.

### 7. Toilets

- After media reports, the toilets have been under scrutiny.
- Children are allowed to use toilets indoors and can be given passes for entry.
- Exhaust fans are to be installed at Bush Campus and repaired at Main Campus
- The toilets by the Hall are used the most and they have had Uric Acid permeate the concrete. The School will organise for a High powered Acid wash.
- It was agreed that the toilets should be cleaned twice a day.

### Motion: For the P&C to fund a daily cleaner between 11.45am-12.45pm.

### Canteen report – via email

- Operation with 2 new supervisors in a job share arrangement going well
- The last fun day in term 1 with home made pizzas was the biggest in over a year so menu
  changes were very popular. Some small glitches in handing out the Gelato which are easily
  addressed in the operations procedures for next time
- We need two new ovens to replace the one we have, and will bring forward a motion next month. All costs expected to be contained within canteen budget, so still break even
- With Mabel's departure as book keeper, we would like some input into what the new book keeper will do to support the canteen. Who can we talk to?
  - The P&C Secretary & Treasurer will ensure sub-committee needs are taken into account with replacement Bookkeeper.

We also need some P&C direction on the requirements for canteen volunteers and Stat Dec or WWCC. Who can help? The School's Business Manager can help.
